Lighthouse Atlantic Area Governance project

- Financial allocation for this call for proposals is around 3,75 M€ in ERDF and 4,05M€ in total (Interreg funds + national co-financing).
- Considering the ERDF allocated, only one project will be selected.
- The project will be approximately programmed for a five-year duration.

How the AA Programme should face this new Priority/ISO1

- Why a new type of projects linked to governance?
 - Funding support for “Better governance for cooperation in the Atlantic Area” under priority 4, Interreg Specific Objective 1 (ISO 1).
 - Objective: Enhance cooperation and efficiency in implementing Programme's strategies.

Introduction

How the AA Programme should face this new Priority/ISO1

- Why focus on “environment”?
 - Anchored on EU policy initiatives: European Blue Growth Strategy, European Green Deal, Territorial Agenda 2030 and EU Atlantic Maritime Strategy.
 - Mission: Transition to a carbon-neutral and climate-resilient Atlantic Area Region.
 - Most of the projects financed by Atlantic Area Programme are environment based.

CALL's AIM

- Develop a **new type of project** (umbrella Project) able to make a step further on the **results enhancement and the diffusion** (taking on board previous AA programming periods).
- **Feed existing or potential governance networks** to inspire or influence public policies and decisions.
- Provide **more visibility to selected projects** results by enhancing the AA and its projects' impact. The aim is to capitalise on results for specific strategic issues in the AA.

CALL's AIM

- **Better coordination with existing or potential governance networks** able to influence public policies and work with policy makers such as the Atlantic Strategy and other identified relevant stakeholders. Coordination with other ETC Programmes should be included to respond to the mid-term evaluation recommendations.
- Expected to **provide inputs** contributing to the programme's ongoing and shape **future post 2027**.

Type of expected activities (all compulsory)

- Carry out a joint results dissemination: 5 activities
- Facilitate the transfer of practices and results: 5 activities
- Increase coordination and dialogue between stakeholders: 5 activities

Carry out a joint results dissemination

Identification and analysis of knowledge, experiences, and project results



Identify and analyse the project's results from past and current projects.



Develop a results database / digital library of programme results and deliverables that reinforce the visibility of the programme.



Analyse and decide if the project's **results could be used elsewhere**.



Create linkages between projects addressing similar issues to promote complementarities.



Disseminate collected knowledge to targeted actors.

Facilitate the transfer of practices and results

Encourage the transfer of results and practices to key stakeholders



Set up activities to **gather, transfer and amplify project results**.



Establish relationships with relevant decision makers with the aim of transfer results into public policies (local, regional, national, and European).



Organise joint events to share previous experiences and results transfer (including networking) to stakeholders and/or decision-makers to amplify the projects' results.



Assess the challenges faced and the benefits of the transfer of practices to improve the process along the Lighthouse Atlantic Area Governance project lifetime.



For the “single” AA projects part of the community created by the Lighthouse Atlantic Area Governance project, facilitate their abilities to better access new contacts, networks and improve their skills in communication and/or advocacy to better promote their own project results.

Strengthening coordination between existing Atlantic network and strategies to achieve better governance.



Promote initiatives with other projects and ERDF programmes to address common challenges.



Facilitate thematic exchanges with European and international institutions.



Development of joint transnational action plans.



Develop a strategy paper with recommendations:

- on how project results might be included regional/national and European policies already in place, such as the Atlantic Maritime Strategy.
- Provide inputs contributing to improve the programme's ongoing and future development, activities, and projects programming.

Expected activities

Should be:

- ✓ Achieved approximately in **5 years** implementation and budget
- ✓ Compulsory
- ✓ Clearly understandable

What are the expected outputs of the “Lighthouse Atlantic Area Governance Project”?

Should :

- ✔ Contribute to **draft policy implementing measures and recommendations**, prepare Memorandum of Understanding (MoUs), improve procedures, implement transferring and mainstreaming plans.
- ✔ Contribute to **reinforce existing networks of authorities and stakeholders**, (e.g., maximise investments through complementary and/or common interventions as well as capitalisation activities).

What are the expected Results of the “Lighthouse Atlantic Area Governance Project”?

- ✓ **A more coordinated approach to thematic issues** with local, regional, national, and European policies thanks to collectively empowered results of Interreg Atlantic Area projects.
- ✓ **Increased institutional capacity of Atlantic public authorities to transform** public policies, governance, and transnational cooperation (e.g., maximise investments through complementary and/or common interventions as well as capitalisation activities).
- ✓ **For the projects** for which the results are considered valuable and transferable, **increase their availability to enhance and spread-out.**
- ✓ **Increased coordination and cooperation** between regional, national, and supranational institutions/bodies and programmes acting in the area, as well as with strategies and initiatives.

Expected partnership structure

- ✓ **One public authority by MS** (as a full or associated partner) relevant in thematic addressed.
- ✓ The **project partnership** must be set up with **partners from the 4 different Atlantic Area countries:** France, Ireland, Portugal and Spain.
- ✓ **Profit making private partners** will not be allowed to participate in this call.
- ✓ **Full partners by project should be between 10 and 15, at least 2 by each MS.** The role of the Lead Partner can only be held by: Public organizations; Organisations governed by public law; Not-for-profit private organisations.
